# Young sheikh quick to make mark and back new passion with pride

Since making his first racecourse visit one year ago, member of Qatar royal family has become a key player in the sport, **Alan Lee** discovers

As year ago, Sheikh Fahad Al Thani paid his first visit to a British racecourse to watch the 2,000 Guineas. He liked what he saw so much, he bought the whole package. Tomorrow, when the Sheikh returns to Newmarket, Qipco, his family company, is sponsoring the meeting and Makfi, last year's winner, featured among his rapidly acquired equine riches.

Even in the fantasy-filled world of the Turf, few have made such a spectacular entrance, let alone so young. Sheikh Fahad, a nephew of the Emir of Qatar, will be 22 on June 15, the second day of Royal Ascot. David Redvers, his bloodstock agent and adviser, is on notice that a birthday winner is desired.

Sheikh Fahad has embraced the sport so warmly that Qipco is backing the evolutionary British Champions' Series to the tune of several million pounds. He sees this and his breeding interests as shrewd business but the 42 horses racing under his Pearl Bloodstock banner are feeding a passion.

Just how deep became clear this week as I accompanied Sheikh Fahad to Ireland. He had left London early, swapping his suite at the Dorchester Hotel for a six-seater plane that ducked into Gloucestershire to collect

us before crossing the Irish Sea bound for the Co Meath yard of Ger Lyons, base for seven of the Pearl horses.

Six months ago, Sheikh Fahad and Redvers attended the Keeneland yearling sales. "We went to buy three or four," the Sheikh reflected. "We came back with 11." Several were placed with Lyons. "Ger is always giving us good news in his reports. It's time we went to see them for ourselves."

A pile of newspapers sat on a spare seat with reports of the previous day's launch of the Champions' Series. The Sheikh smiled in recollection of support from such luminaries as Henry Cecil and John Gosden for a concept that had stirred bad blood in Newmarket last autumn.

"I was aware there was opposition before we got involved. I understand that people don't like change but I believe, after this year, they will come to realise it is a good thing. I had been thinking about it long before the sponsorship. To me, British racing had the best horses and I could not understand why it had nothing like the Breeders' Cup. Qipco has a lot of new investment in the UK and we were looking to raise awareness. This was a perfect fit."

Qipco, based amid the restless expansion of Doha, is a diverse investment company run by Sheikh Fahad

and his two elder brothers, Sheikhs Hamad and Suhaim. All three siblings are expected at Newmarket for the first anniversary of the racing enlightenment. "I had watched British racing on TV but I had never been to a track," Sheikh Fahad recalled. "I loved the whole experience of Guineas day."

As betting and drinking are prerequisites for the majority of British racegoers, is there a conflict with his Muslim principles? "It doesn't directly affect me," he reasoned. "And if they are betting and drinking, they are still watching the horses and creating a racing atmosphere you cannot find any-

where else — certainly not in Qatar but not in France or America, either."

Inquisitive by nature, mature way beyond his years, Sheikh Fahad has absorbed racing wisdom voraciously since that first day at Newmarket when Redvers, personally recruited to find him his first horses, had planned a

hectic educational morning, which somehow survived his client's late arrival for second lot with the punctilious Sir Mark Prescott.

Redvers was cut some slack as an owner with Sir Mark, a status he had acquired only after his infamous invasion of the House of Commons to

protest against the anti-hunting bill. "I'd tried for five years to have a horse in training there. Sir Mark rang me when I got out of jail and said I'd finally passed the test," Redvers said ruefully.

A year ago, over lunch in the Jockey Club Rooms, Sheikh Fahad fell under the spell of Sir Mark's mesmeric

## Royal appointment

- Sheikh Fahad Bin Abdullah Bin Khalifa Al Thani is one of six brothers and a member of the royal family of Qatar. His father is brother of the Emir, who is attending the royal wedding today.
- He studied in London for five years, including a business administration course on the London campus of the Geneva Business School.
- Qipco was established in 1999 and is run by Sheikh Fahad and his brothers. It stands for Qatar Investment and Projects Development Holding Company.
- Sheikh Fahad has 42 horses in training and his Qatar Bloodstock company has two stallions and 20 broodmares.
- Qipco is sponsoring the 35-race British Champions' Series, which climaxes at Ascot on October 15 with the richest race day staged in Britain.

anecdotes. "He has so many stories, why doesn't he write a book?" Pearl Ice, a promising three-year-old, is now installed at Heath House Stables, along with a pair of two-year-olds.

On the aircraft, the Sheikh was formally dressed in dark blue suit and a blazing red tie that he later loosened,

though declined to remove, in the warm midday sunshine at Glenburnie Stables. Sheikh Fahad patronises 14 trainers across four countries but Lyons has the most horses — recognition of his role in a first-season profit through the pragmatic sale of Wade Giles to Hong Kong for a million euros.

Lyons, a former jump jockey, had Johnny Murtagh along to sit on the juveniles and pass judgment. The two Irishmen indulged in a wisecracking routine. "Do you think they rehearse it?" the Sheikh asked, amused, before putting his trainer on the spot. "Are there any of these you don't want?" Lyons demurred but pointed to a filly. "She should win a handicap and then she won't be on your team."

It is forthright and unemotional, just the way Sheikh Fahad likes it. He takes advice but reserves the right to impose himself. In Kentucky, he selected and bid for a filly by Any Given Saturday — hence the name Choice Pearl. Meanwhile, a chestnut colt by Tapit was targeted by Redvers. "I didn't like him but David insisted," he recalled. So he was bought for \$420,000 (£252,000) and is now called Qatar's Pearl.

It was Redvers who came up with the Pearl Bloodstock name. "Qatar was known for pearl fishing and there seemed something fitting about us trying to find pearls in the sand," the agent explained. Sheikh Fahad added: "I didn't want to race them under my own name in the first year but I think we will keep using Pearl now."

Breeding is conducted under the name of Qatar Bloodstock. Makfi will

shuttle between Redvers's Tweenhills Stud and New Zealand and already has 150 mares booked at £25,000 a time. Total Gallery, a group one-winning sprinter, will go to stud after one more season racing.

To the Sheikh, it is a commercial investment. "We never dreamt we could get the Guineas winner in our first year. Breeding is a risk but I believe we are going into it at the right time. Four or five years ago, it would have been very difficult. The market will come back, though."

Back on the plane, he was once more showing and seeking knowledge. "Why does the new jumps season start the day after the old one ended? It just makes for small fields," Sheikh Fahad attended the Cheltenham Festival last month and was enraptured. "It tempted me to try and buy one or two jumps horses — but it would only be filling in the winter months. I love the Flat."

He spoke of Facebook and football, as other 21-year-olds might, but not in the same way. The Sheikh admitted he would not know how to start with social networking and his love of football — especially Arsenal — is contextualised by Qatar's hosting of the 2022 World Cup. "In Qatar now, it is the only sport people know," he said.

Not so, Sheikh Fahad. He has three runners tomorrow, including Group Therapy in the Pearl Bloodstock Palace House Stakes. One year on, and so much has changed. He settled back in his seat and smiled contentedly. "I think fate put this whole thing together," he murmured.
